



# NORTH CAROLINA POULTRY FEDERATION COMMEMORATES 2025 ENVIRONMENTAL AWARD WINNERS AND NEW BOARD ELECTION AT ANNUAL MEETING

Greensboro, N.C., October 13, 2025 – The North Carolina Poultry Federation (NCPF) held its annual meeting at the Grandover Resort & Conference Center on October 1-3. This was the 58<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Federation and included the election of the 2025-2026 Board of Directors, an Awards Banquet honoring this year's environmental award winners as well as retiring Executive Director Robert L. Ford. With record attendance, this year's meeting boasted a golf tournament – both 2-man and 4-man scrambles – as well as a sporting clays tournament and evening entertainment by "The Johnson Boy's" band.


